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TVEA RECOMMENDS TWO CANDIDATES FOR TVUSD SCHOOL BOARD

Temecula Teachers Support Parent Cheryl Eckard and Retired Teacher Sandy Hinkson for Election in the November School Board Election.

Temecula teachers are pleased to announce their support for two of the seven candidates running for TVUSD School Board. Last week, the Temecula Valley Educators Association (TVEA) interviewed all seven declared candidates individually seeking information about their perspective of the role of a board member and their vision for the district. A five member panel including Co-Chairs Alexa Ingram-Dupart and Rafael Loza, elementary teacher Cheryl Bryant, middle school teacher Peter Ricchio, and high school teacher Mitchell Brown represented TVEA.

TVEA recommends the election of Cheryl and Sandy because they are respected long-time members of our educational community. Their own adult children were highly successful students in our Temecula schools. They are well informed citizens who TVEA believes will communicate effectively with all stakeholder groups including parents, students, and teachers. They will ask the tough questions about issues like the district budget and common core implementation.

Temecula teachers have been in protracted contact negotiations with the Temecula Valley Unified District for twenty months, since January 2013. Teachers' contract expired in June 2013 and negotiations have become contentious. When the TVUSD board voted 3-0 with two members absent August 19th to extend the contracts of two assistant superintendents until 2018 and Superintendent Tim Ritter until 2019 TVEA argued it was ill timed. This was emblematic of the "rubber stamp" relationship the current board has with district management. Temecula teachers look forward to electing board members who will be visible in our schools, be accessible to community members, and strengthen the voice of those being represented by the school board.

It is with a great sense of honor that I write this message to you as your TVEA President. The 14-15 school year is well upon us and although our work can be very rewarding we start looking at the calendar months ahead for holiday relief.

It is a challenging time for TVEA yet I believe we are meeting those challenges head on. Our members continue to be the driving force in delivering quality instruction and making the connections with children that will inspire them to do their best.

Those will continue into the middle of the month, with our largest groups of parents yet to come at Chaparral and Great Oak on Wednesday Sept 17th and Temecula Valley on Thursday September 18th. Mediation will continue with a TVEA/TVUSD session on Friday October 3rd and we should have a better idea of where we go next at that time. I will continue to update you as appropriate to aid in keeping you informed.

Finally, our overarching goal the Executive Board chose to work toward at the outset of the year is to seek information from members on how to best communicate to and from TVEA. Internally, we are seeking to break down barriers between Executive Board, Bargaining, and Organizing. In this spirit, teams of two TVEA representatives from these groups will be at your site in the month of September engaging your staff in a discussion on the theme of communication. ADVOCATING ON YOUR BEHALF

One of the primary functions of a local teacher's association is to protect contractual rights and working conditions. So far in the 2014-14 school year TVEA has:



- Represented three different members in Uniform Complaint Hearings at the District or Board Level
- Represented three other members in district level or site level grievance hearings
- Filed a compliance complaint regarding the Williams Act in regard to lack of math textbooks at GOHS
- Requested the district enforce the contract language that requires the posting of class sizes by the 3rd Friday of the school year
- Advocated for member concerns in meetings with the Superintendent and HRD Director related to class size, disruptive students, voluntary transfers, 6/5th assignments
- TVEA President has made eighteen announced site visits in the first month of the school year allowing members to share concerns to be relayed to the district
- Members who have spoken thoughtfully during public comments at the Aug 19 and Sept 2 School Board Meetings include: Jeff Aynesworth (GOHS), Preston Beach (GOHS), Cheryl Bryant (TES), Rob Clause (CHS), Bob Eilek (TMS), Tony Rossi (CHS), and Jeff Kingsberg (TVEA).

TVEA SEEKS MEMBER FEEDBACK ON 2 WAY COMMUNICATION

TVEA Executive Board met on August 22 for its yearly planning conference. After setting some general ground rules for Executive Board and Leadership Council meetings, the group reviewed TVEA's various ways of communicating with its members. Centered around the general goal of effective communication the board devised a plan to get out to all twenty seven sites over the month of September and gather valuable input from members on the following two open ended questions:

- 1) How would you like TVEA to communicate with you?
- 2) How would you like to communicate with TVEA?

The Executive Board members paired off with either a Bargaining Team or

Organizing Committee Member and are scheduling a 30 minute site visit through site leaders to facilitate this discussion. TVEA Executive Board has set a goal of October 15th to meet and discuss the common threads and implications of these from the site visits. We will share the results with you by early November.

Please try to participate at your site if at all possible. This is the most comprehensive effort TVEA has ever made to get its various representatives out to the sites for face to face discussion. We hope that this project is successful and is a regular feature of how TVEA keeps up with member concerns.

Q&A WITH GARY CHECK – TVEA's INSURANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE CHAIR

What is the Insurance Advisory Council (IAC) and who are TVEA's representatives?

The Insurance Advisory Committee is made up of 5 certificated employees, 5 classified employees, and 5 administrative employees. The responsibility of the IAC is to review current insurance policies and to search for other carriers that may offer the same or better coverage with lower premiums.

My insurance contribution has increased yet again. Why another increase this year?

Nearly every year insurance premiums have increased. Over the past several years you have noticed it more as the district cap of \$743.50 has not changed. This means every dollar your policy has increased has been passed on directly to you.

Does our agreement with SISC offer us the best rates?

Currently SISC offers the best premiums. Last year we got bids from other carriers and none were even close to the premiums from SISC.

I am a single person. Why do I pay the same rates as does a member with a large family?

Our current coverage is super-composite. What this means is everyone pays the same premiums.

Some districts have opt-out policies for members who do not need coverage. Is TVEA considering this?

SISC did allow opt-out when we initially signed on with them. After the original enrollment date, members are not allowed to opt-out.

Can TVEA negotiate with the district an adjustment to the cap amount TVUSD pays?

Yes

What kind of information can I expect from the Insurance Advisory Committee in conjunction with the TVEA Executive Board in the coming year?

The IAC can provide any information needed. We will keep you updated as best we can with the Affordable Care Act. Also, the certificated IAC believe it might be in the best interest to survey members about staying super-composite or moving towards a tiered rate. In addition, we would like to explore making dental and vision coverage optional. This would allow for at least one monthly cost (approximately \$125.00) as an opt-out option.

CONFERENCES

CTA SUMMER INSTITUTE

Alexa Ingram-Dupart Political Action Committee Co-Chairperson

I was very fortunate to have the opportunity to attend the CTA Summer Institute in August. I took the Political Science Fair Strand, which I felt could also be named Campaign 101. I learned about polling, internal and external messaging, and community mapping. I now understand the basics of designing a campaign and putting together a campaign budget. There were sessions on the use of Social Media in campaigning as well as some great online tools to help research and direct resources where they will provide the highest benefit on election day. Our instructors were the Political Science Organizers from various regions of California.

On the first day Tom Torlakson came to speak with us and answer questions. Tom is a former science teacher, county supervisor and legislator who is also our State Superintendent of Public Education. He is running for re-election against Marshall Tuck, a Wall Street financier who is not friendly to teachers as he is for high stakes testing and for-profit privatization of education. CTA wants to get the word out on Tom. We need him to continue as our State superintendent of Education, as he will continue to fight for us against high stakes testing and other unfriendly teacher reforms.

Finally I want to tell you about how much fun it was to go to a CTA event. I was tremendously impressed with our organization. The events were well planned and awesome. We had a food truck night! It was spectacular. Because there was a shortage of drivers, some of the CTA Board members drove us back and forth in the shuttle to the parking lot. They are truly people who serve! Everyone was so accessible and friendly. I really felt like I was part of the biggest, most powerful association in the country. I came home energized for our school board election. With your help I know we will prevail.

Rob Clause, TVEA 2nd Vice President Fiscal Analysis and Reports Chair

In early August I spent five days at UCLA for the CTA Summer Institute. Since I have great interest in learning more about school budgets, I chose the school finance strand. The presenters and the material covered were fantastic. We not only went over the school budget process, but learned how to read district financial documents, key things to look for within financial documents, ways to compare districts, and how to increase the financial literacy of our organization.

One of the most important suggestions from the training was to develop a budget book at the TVEA office. This is now in process and will include all of TVUSD's major financial reports for the last three years. We can then use this material to evaluate trends, inconsistencies, and the accuracy of TVUSD projections

year after year. I'm optimistic that the budget book will be an important first step as we develop our new Fiscal Analysis and Reports Committee.

The presenters also emphasized the importance of gathering comparability data from similar local districts, including not only such things as current salary and benefits, but also how to calculate career earnings in a district. Based on the formula we used, a TVUSD teacher will earn over \$130,000 less in salary than a Murrieta teacher over the course of a career.

Overall the Institute was a fantastic learning experience and I would strongly encourage people to attend if the opportunity arises. In addition to the finance strand that I attended, there are a number of other strands available, including organization, political action, and more.

This summer I had the opportunity to attend CTA's Summer Institute at UCLA. If you have never been to a CTA sponsored professional development conference I highly recommend you attend one if you get a chance. CTA conferences are designed to help members face the challenges they encounter in their schools, their local chapters and on a statewide level. The summer institute offers trainings on Bargaining Skills, Communications, Emerging Leaders, Member Benefits, Legal, Instructional Professional Development, Political Science Fair, School Finance and Tax Fairness and Economic Justice.

I attended the Instructional Professional Development Strand (IPD) which offered training and skill building on teaching and learning of Common Core Standards, instruction and the new assessments, emphasizing new strategies and best practices for the classroom teacher.

One of the key resources I would like to share is http://ctaipd.ning.com which is the CTA IPD strand website. It is a wealth of resources including connections to the speakers who have presented at past CTA workshops and links to common core resources for the classroom. Another one is the link to one of our keynote speakers, Bob Darnell who works for Achievement Strategies Inc. http://achievementstrategies.org/presentations.html His website is full of ideas and resources for assessment, class management, curriculum and standards and also includes slides from his presentations nationwide.

With all the changes that are happening in our classrooms with Common Core implementation, professional development is key.
